Taking your dog to the beach this Summer?

Most dogs love to go to the beach over summer to enjoy the sun, sand and water as well as the company of other dogs.

If you plan to take your dog to the beach this summer, make sure their vaccination and heartworm treatment are up to date, as well as their flea and tick prevention. Bowral Vet Hospital stocks products to make this all stress free for you, such as a yearly C5 vaccination and yearly Proheart injection for heartworm prevention, as well as spot on or chews for flea and tick treatment, such as Bravecto or Nexgard.

Some tips to ensure maximum fun and safety at the beach are:

- Choose a dog friendly beach – research on line before you leave
- Teach your dog to swim
- Ensure there is fresh water and shade, or take a bottle of water and a bowl
- Look out for dangers in the sand
- Finish up with a good rinse in fresh water and take a towel for a good rub down before the trip home

SNAKE SEASON

Following on from the near plague proportions of rats that we have experienced this year, there are now a large number of well fed snakes in our area. Every year in Australia over 6,000 pets are bitten by a snake (Royal Canin). If your pet does get bitten, keep them as still as possible and get them to a vet ASAP. Time is a factor in determining whether they will survive.

To keep your pets as safe as possible this summer, there are a number of things you can do in your own backyard:

- Keep walkways and garden areas clear
- Keep lawns mowed and well maintained
- Clean up any spilled food or bird seed that may attract rodents and therefore snakes
- Store firewood away from the house


